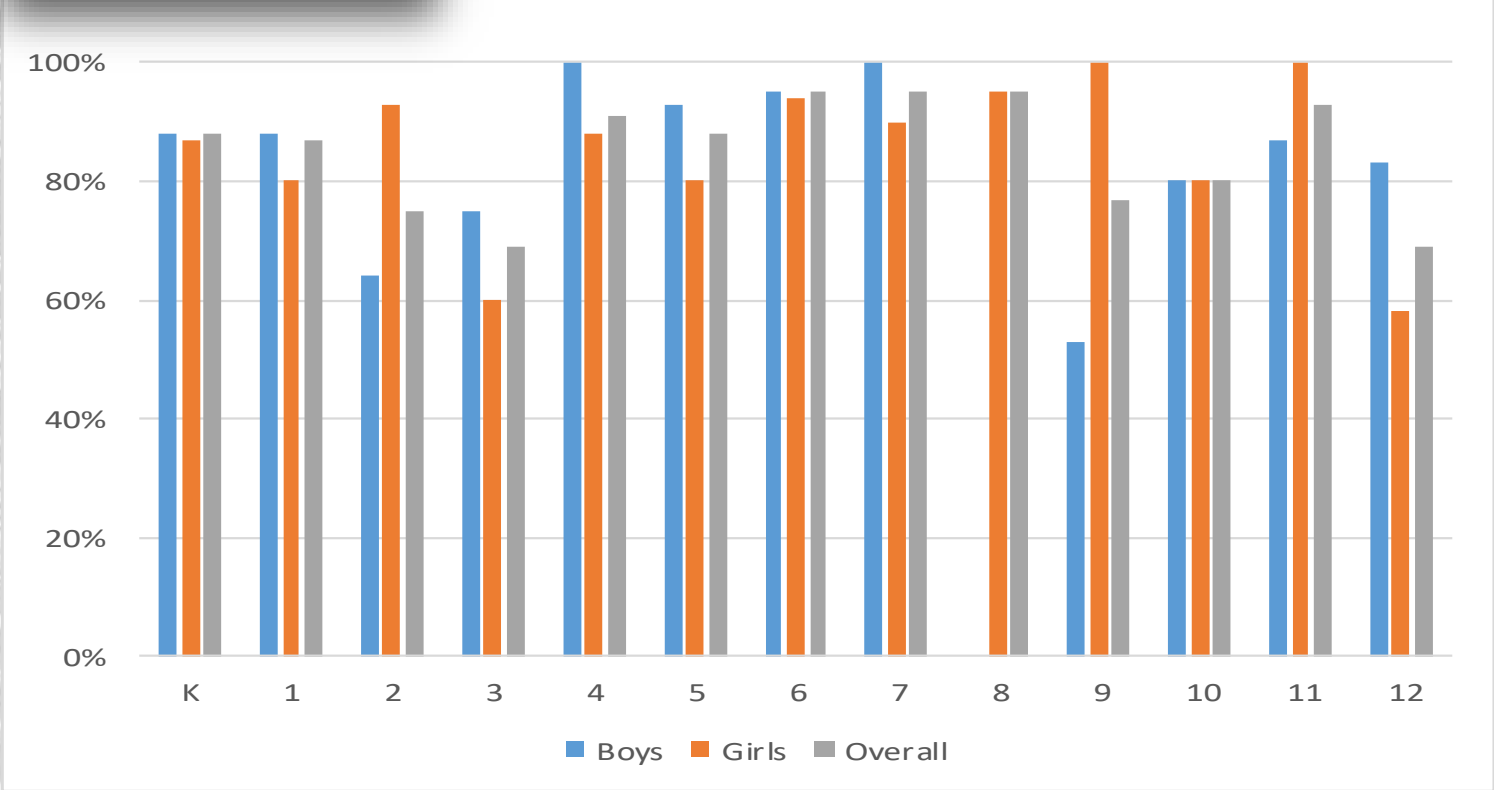

Recipes students have made this term

IMPOSSIBLE CHEESEBURGER PIE

500 g minced beef or lamb
½ tsp salt
1 cup milk
2 eggs

1 cup chopped onion
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
1/3 cup SR flour
PRE-HEAT oven to 200°C

METHOD: Cook mince and onion. Drain. STIR in salt.
SPREAD in greased 220mm pie plate. Sprinkle with cheese.

STIR the flour, eggs and milk together with a fork until blended.
POUR over the mince, onion and cheese mixture.

BAKE for 25 minutes or until knife inserted in centre comes out clean.

IMPOSSIBLE PIE.

4 eggs,
½ cup plain flour,
1 cup sugar,
2 teaspoons vanilla essence,

½ cup butter,
2 cups milk,
1 cup coconut,

METHOD.

Mix all ingredients together, pour into 25cm greased pie plate, bake 180 degrees C. for 1 hour or until centre is firm, the flour settles to form the crust, the coconut forms a topping and the centre is an egg custard.
