

Continue to support your child in learning and remembering their arithmetic facts by asking them to do simple arithmetic tasks for you at home. For instance, ask them "how many slices of bread will we use to make sandwiches for lunch?" Follow up by asking "How many slices of bread are in one loaf? If we have sandwiches 4 times in one week, how many loaves of bread will I need to buy each week?"

Stage 4 (Years 7 and 8) Maths students have started to how to use algebra to represent problems they encounter. So far we have discussed how we use a single letter to replace a whole word. For instance, we might use *t* to stand for the amount of time it takes to cook and prepare a roast dinner when we are trying to figure out when to start preparing dinner to have it ready at a certain time.

Now would be a good time to discuss with your child what time they should get up in the morning in order to be ready to leave for school on time. Have your child work out exactly what activities (such as eating and brushing their teeth) that they need to do each morning and estimate the time needed to get each activity done. Then have them work backwards to figure out what time they would need to get up. The amount of time needed to get ready in the morning is a **variable** because it varies from person to person. Work out the activities and time you need to get ready each day and compare these with your child. Discuss whether it takes more or less time for you to get ready then it does them.

This is the last day for students to turn in their Integers Workbook and Directed Number Context Posters.

Stage 5 (Years 9 and 10) Maths students are beginning their study of Similarity and Scale Drawings. We will be looking at how we use the geometric properties of similar figures to create scale drawings such as floor plans and maps.





Now would be a good time to discuss with your child how to read a map, whether it's a paper map, Google maps online, your vehicle's navigation system or an app on your phone. If you have a GPS device in your vehicle (such as Navman) or an app on your phone that you use when driving, program a destination in and discuss with your child how the device or app works to give you directions both with voice and pictures.

Assessment Task 1: Portfolio 1 is due Friday 20 March (Week 7).

This is the last date for students to submit any additional work completed on their Trigonometry 1 and Statistics 4 Workbooks.

Year 11 Mathematics Standard students are continuing the topic of Budgeting and Household Expenses. We will be looking the costs involved in purchasing and owning a car this week. Part of the first Assessment Task for Year 11 Mathematics Standard this year is to research a car that someone in the family is either interested in buying or has recently purchased and to calculate all the costs involved in buying, financing, insuring and maintaining the car.

Now would be a good time to discuss with your child all the different costs associated with owning and maintaining a car such as petrol costs, repair and maintenance costs and insurance. If you have a green slip or petrol receipts, show your child and talk about how much you spend on these items for your vehicle.

Assessment Task 1: Financial Mathematics Investigation is due Thursday 19 March (Week 7). Assessment Task notifications have been handed out.



Keep Watch @ Public Pools Policy

Children (under 10 years) are not allowed entry unless under active supervision of a person 16 years or older.

Parents and carers should actively supervise their children at all times. As such, they should be dressed ready for action, including unexpected entry to a pool.

Children 0-5

For 0-5 year olds and nonswimmers a parent or carer is in the water at all times within arms' reach of the child. It is best if you are engaging with your child i.e. playing with them, talking to them.



Children 6-10

For 6-10 year olds constant active supervision is required. Be prepared to get wet and enter the water with this age group.



Children 11-14

For 11-14 year olds it is recommended that parents check up on their child by physically going to the point where they are in or around the water.
